A graphic novel account of the life of Laika, the first dog in space, who died in her experimental launch.

Adamson, Thomas K. **The First Moon Landing**. Mankato: Capstone, 2007.

This book, in graphic novel format, tells the story of the Apollo 11 mission, including the first moon landing in 1969.
