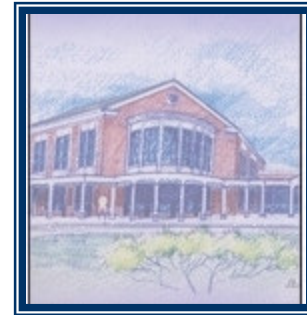

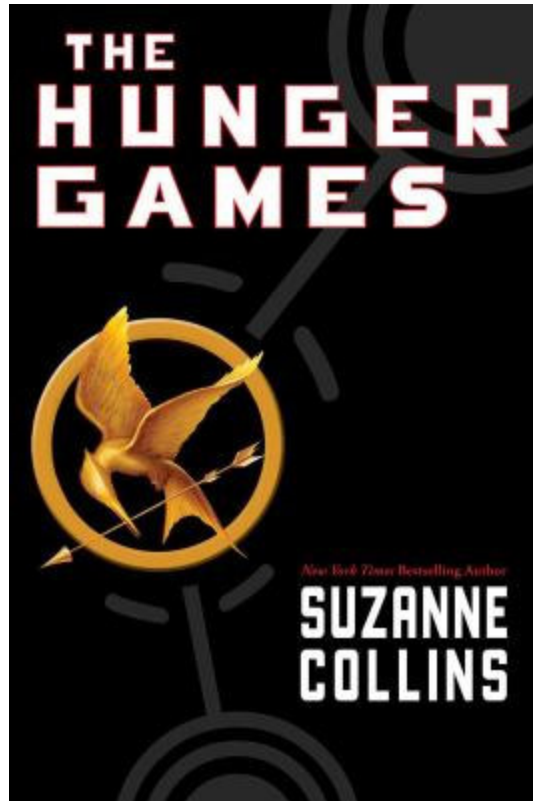
Reader's Advisory

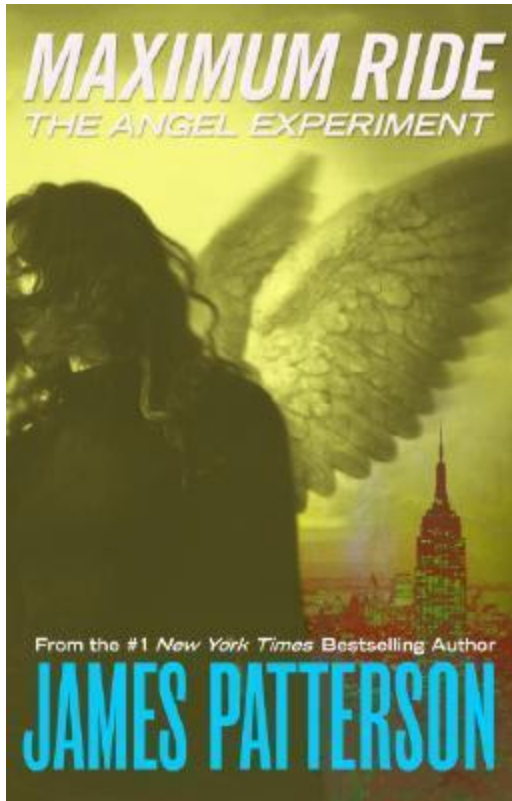

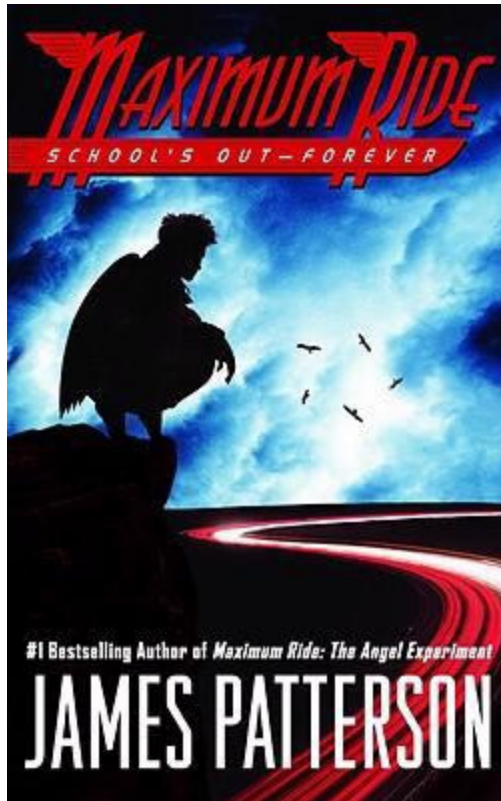
Maximum Ride series:

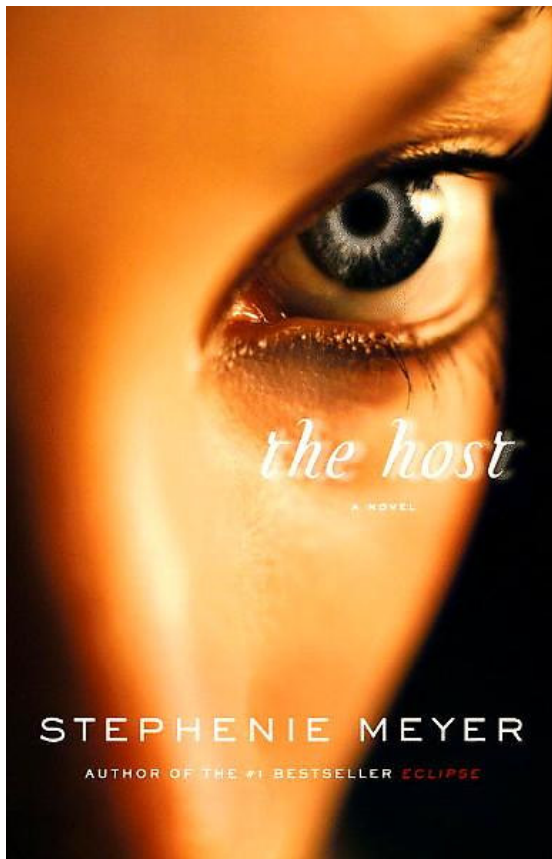

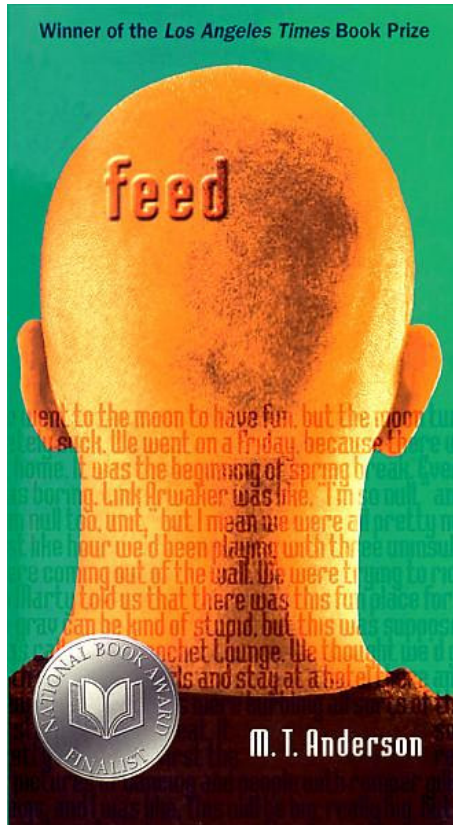
The Host

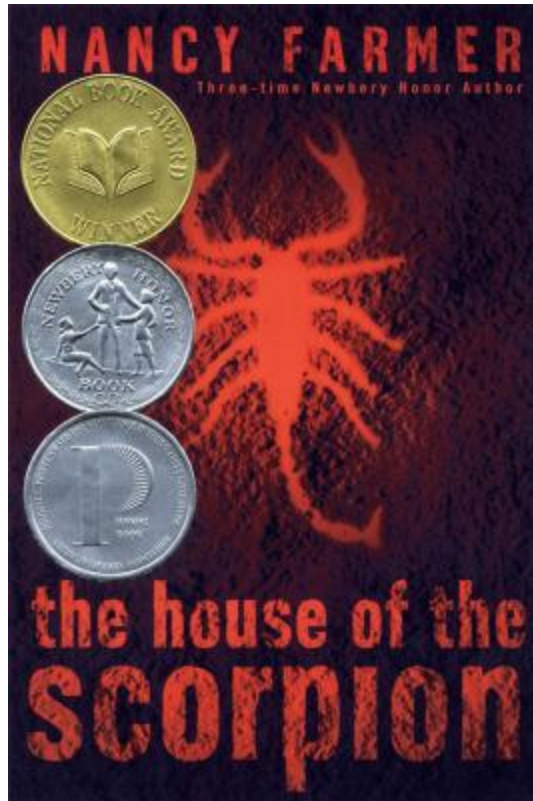

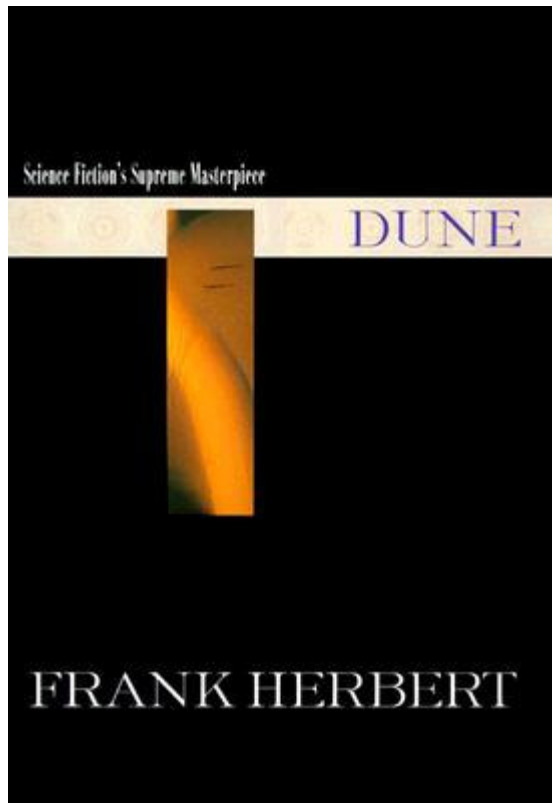


The House of the Scorpion

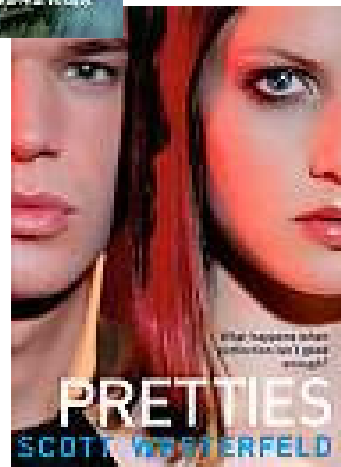
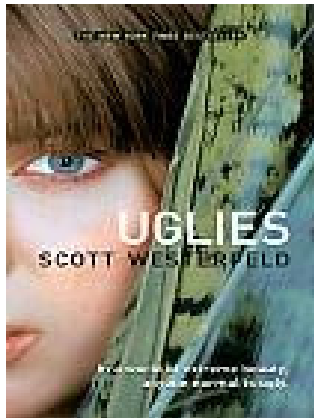
Dune

Uglies

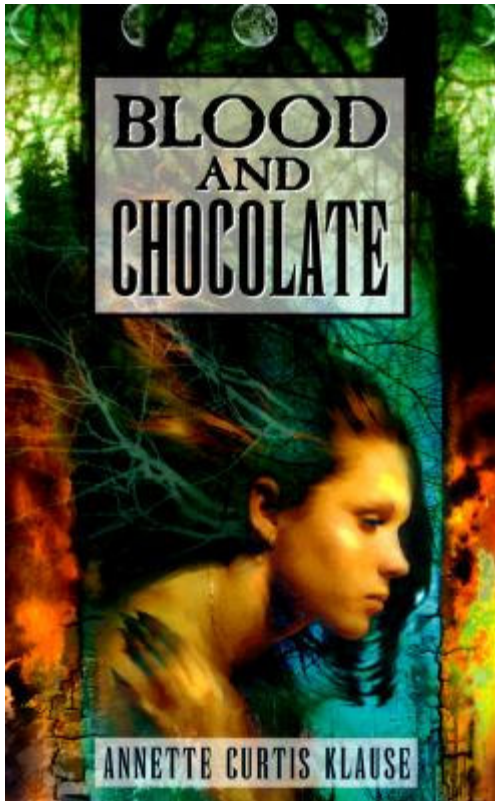
by Scott Westerfeld

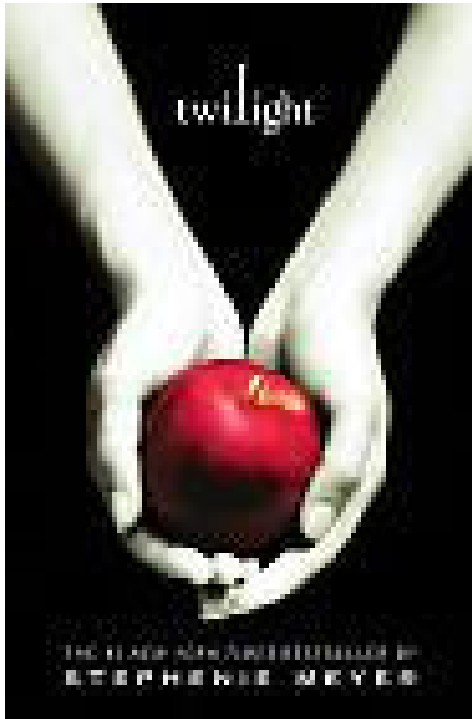

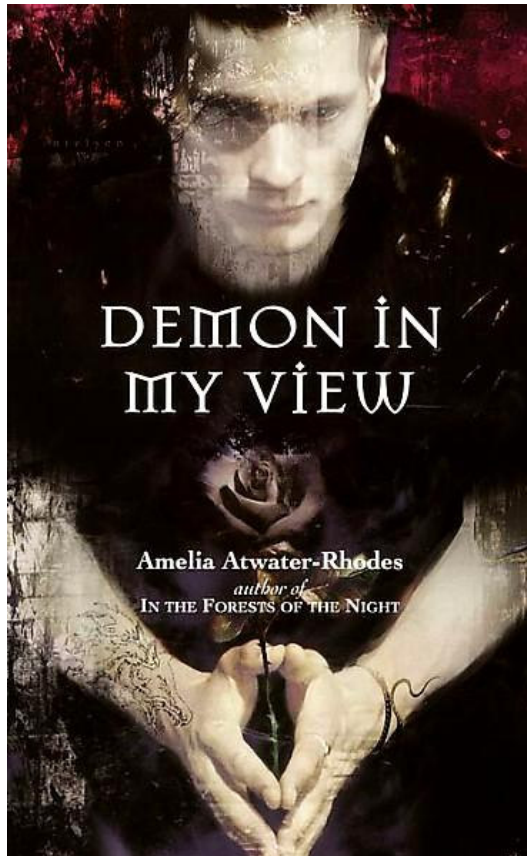
Twilight

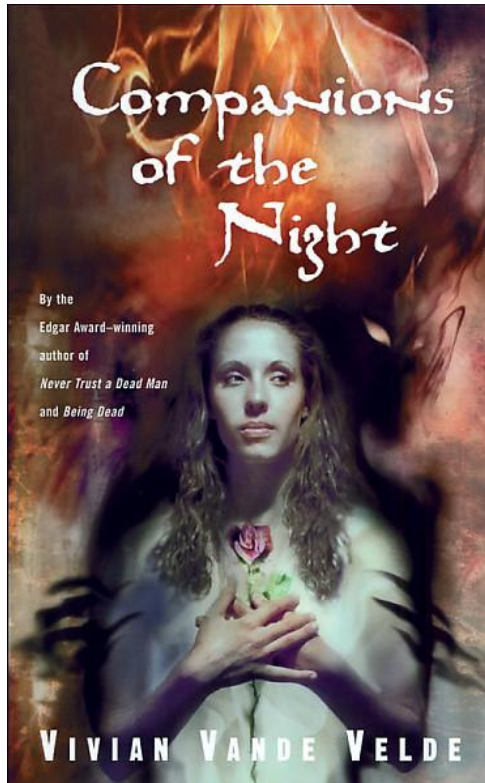


Shattered Mirror
