

Finding Books

Use our **OPAC** (Online Public Access Catalog) to search for books.

You can search by Author, Title, Subject, or Anywhere.

Locate the books in the library using the call number.

- PB** **Paperback** - Paperbacks are arranged in alphabetical order by the author's last name.
- FIC** **Fiction** - Fiction books are novels. They are arranged in alphabetical order by the author's last name.
- 000-999** **Non-Fiction** - The non-fiction books are in Dewey number order on the tall shelves. Different numbers are used for different subjects. For example, sports books are in the 796 section, and books about American history are 973. More than one book can have the same number. Books with the same number are arranged in alphabetical order, usually by the author's last name. When you jot down the call number, be sure to include the letters underneath the number, and the title of the book. This will help you find it on the shelf.
- REF** **Reference** - These books are kept in the tall shelves near the computer lab and are used only in the library.
- B** **Biography** - A biography is a book about a person's life. Biographies are arranged on the shelf by the last name of the person the book is about, not the author's last name. Some libraries use 921 instead of B.
- 920** **Collective biography** - These are books about more than one person's life. They are arranged on the shelf by the author or editor's last name.
- SC** **Story Collection** - These collections of short stories are arranged by the author or editor of the book.
- GN** **Graphic Novels** - book length comic books
- CA** **Career** - books about jobs **HEALTH** - health books about health issues and diseases
- PICT** **Picture books** **PA** - collection of books for parents
- PROF** **Professional Collection** - a collection of professional books for the MS faculty
- OV** **Oversized** - books that are too large to be put on our regular shelves are put in this section.
- WL** **World Languages** - books written in languages other than English.
